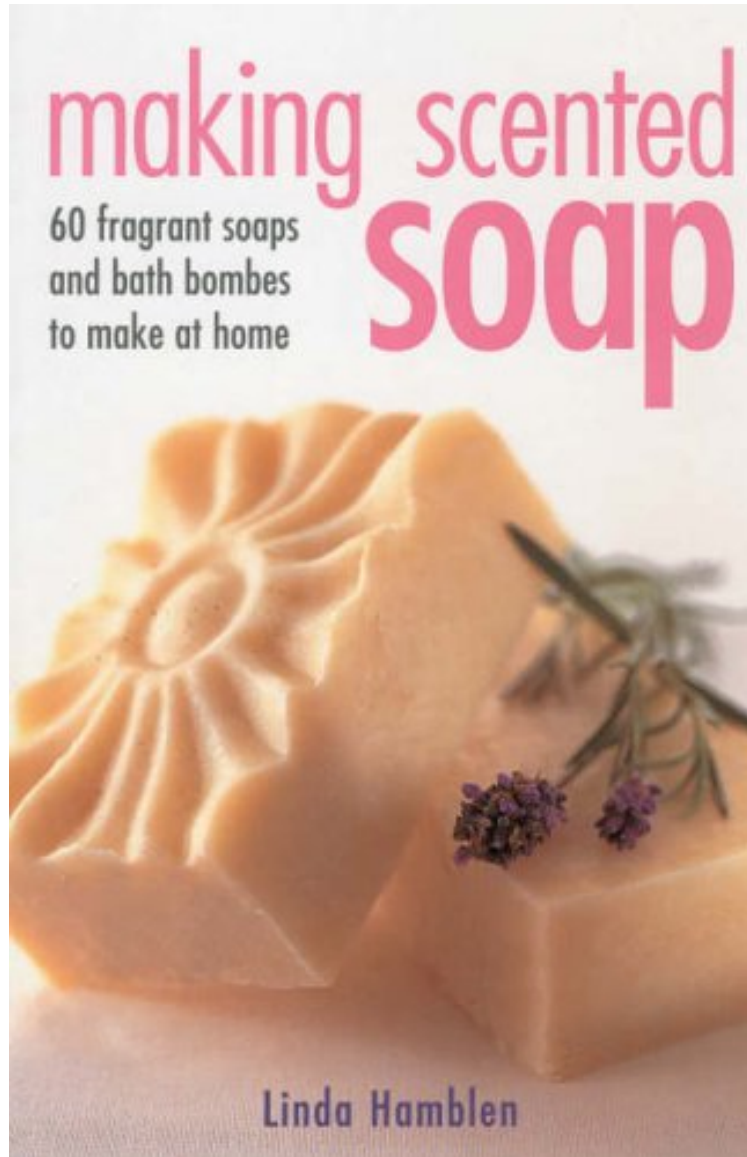

I love the beauty of this book and I used the concepts from it in my early days of learning to make soap. There are some lovely recipes, but they are not balanced for conditioning so they need

to be tweaked through a soap calculator. It is not a book for the inexperienced soap maker, however, there is a wealth of information for the novice to learn in terms of setting up your equipment, safety, essential oil profiles and combinations. In order to know what a good soap recipe is you must learn the properties of the foundation oils used to produce soap in general. Purchase this book with this knowledge, it's sexy with photography and concept, but lacking in quality of recipes, but this can be worked through by recalculation and addition of ingredients. Lastly, I don't understand why the price is so high, even for a used book.
