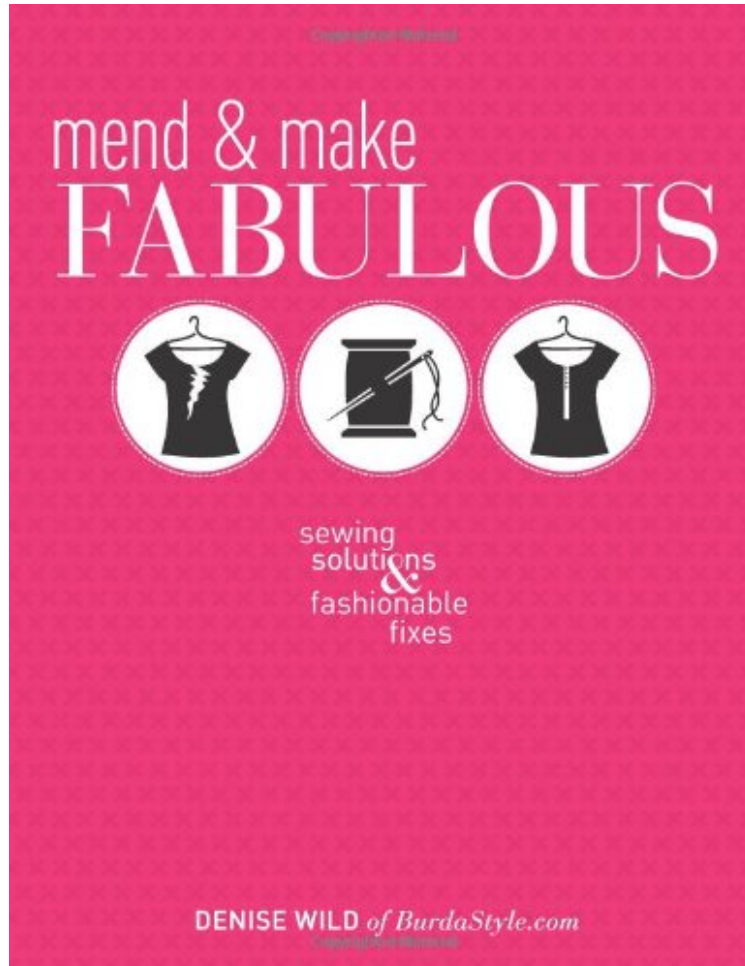

It has the right balance of DIY, creativity and 911 sewing emergency. There is something for everyone in this little reference book. There are seven sections covering tears, seams, lining, hems and tailoring, closures, straps and color. Each gives you 911 basics like how to sew on a button and then ways to "Make It Fabulous" like embellishment with buttons. The information on garment care is good. The book is well-written and an easy read. The layout is clean and fresh. Really experiences sewers probably have this info elsewhere, but it's a good book for those building a library. For those who aren't really into sewing, or clueless when it comes to mending, this book is what you need. Some of the 911 fixes do require a sewing machine.
