It was unique in it's ability to fly with the heavy bombers all the way to Berlin and back. It was more maneuverable than the Spitfire and had more fire power. At the same time I think most people

would also agree that the Me 262 was the most advanced fighter in the war. It was the first and just about the only plane to see front line service, except for the Gloster Meteor which was primarily kept in England for use against the V-1's. This book is very interesting in that it is less oriented to a description of the design and development of the plane, and more concentrated on its use in the field. For instance Me 262 pilots claimed 547 kills of allied planes in air to air combat. This was accomplished (in part) by 38 Aces, all of which are named in the book. The leading ace was Major Georg-Peter Eder with 25 kills. Production quantities by Messerschmitt factory are given. It even mentions the building of the Me 262 in Czechoslovakia after the war under the name Avia S-92. As with all of the books in this series, it is profusely illustrated with some 300 (I guess, I didn't count them) pictures and drawings. These vary from war time photographs to detailed pictures taken of virtually every visible component of the planes at museums around the world.
