The description makes the book sound great, but it doesn't even come close to living up to it. Small format with small, grainy black and white photos. High contrast black and white photos actually work quite well for this type of subject as well as machining topics, but not small grainy ones. For more than twenty years "The Home Shop Machinist" was entirely in black and white, but the photos were always large and clear. It's interesting to see some scale steam engines built in the nineteenth century during the dawn of steam model engineering, but far superior photographs and information can be found online.10 of 10 people found the following review helpful.
