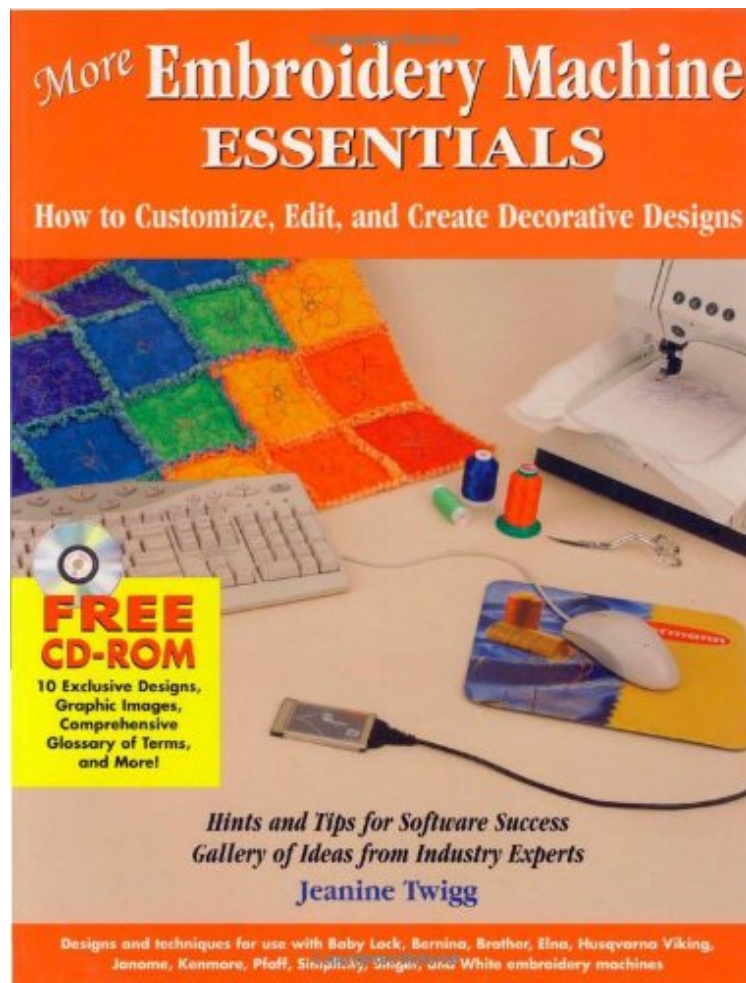

The 3 stars come from the fact that there are now more timely, up-to-date books written for today's high tech machine advances. Since it was written many years ago, there are new machine features and products that weren't around then. Still a good basic info book, but since the embroidery technology has taken big

leaps in the last decade, you may want to ask your embroidery machine retailer for good books. Since the "Free CD-Rom" was missing from my shipment, I was unable to review it. The seller said I could have a partial credit on my next purchase or mail it back. Both options were not cost effective. You will probably have better luck with the seller, and since the price was low, I found a few other books like "The Machine Embroiderer's Bible" that was more helpful for my new machine. My machine manufacturer (Brother International) website has lots of videos that help regardless of what machine you own. 8 of 8 people found the following review helpful. Helpful! I kept thinking by ordering the second book, I wasted my money (again). Now that the second book arrived, I actually opened it up and read it from cover to cover. It will be even more useful as I progress in machine embroidery. The book answered a lot of questions and helped clear up some misconceptions I picked up. All-in-all, I think the book has good information about moving on to bigger and better embroidery, what you need to resize (if you can with your machine), and doesn't feel nearly as dated as the "stabilize" book.
