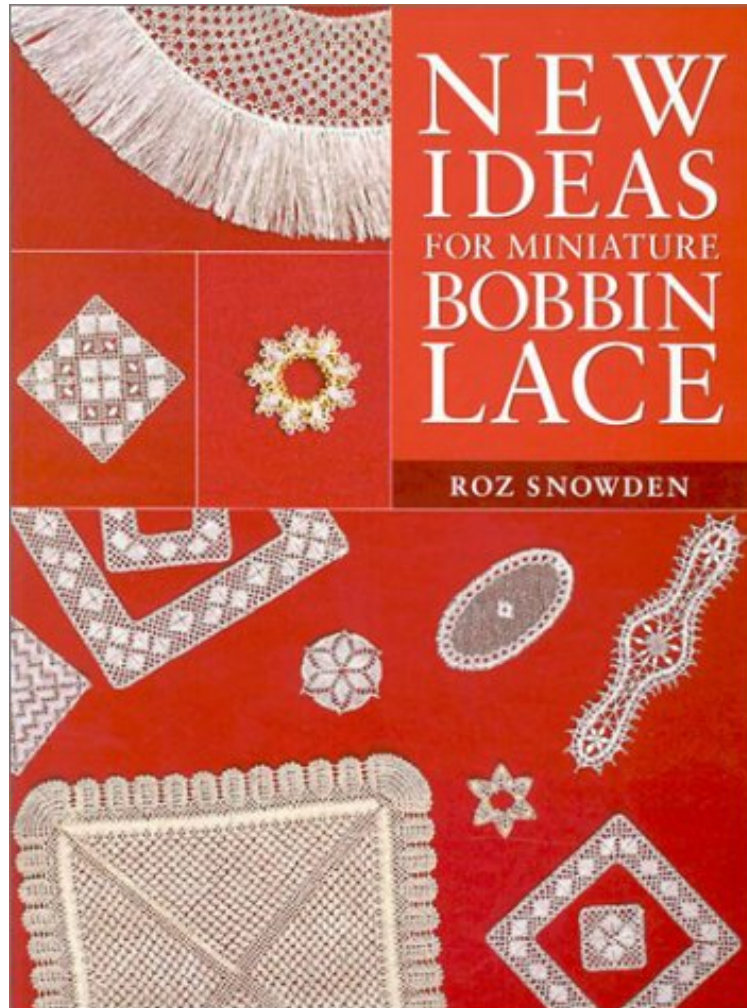

From tiny costumes to diminutive furnishings, these 50 delicate dollhouse miniatures using Torchon, Binche, Bedfordshire, and Buckinghamshire lacework will enchant you. Each design is given in 1/12th scale (easily adapted to 1/24), and includes instructions on the basics, plus pricking patterns, a working diagram, and a photograph of the right side of the finished lace.

Although basic instructions are included, novices in bobbin lace would profit more from books such as Doris Southard's Lessons in Bobbin Lacemaking or Bridget M.
