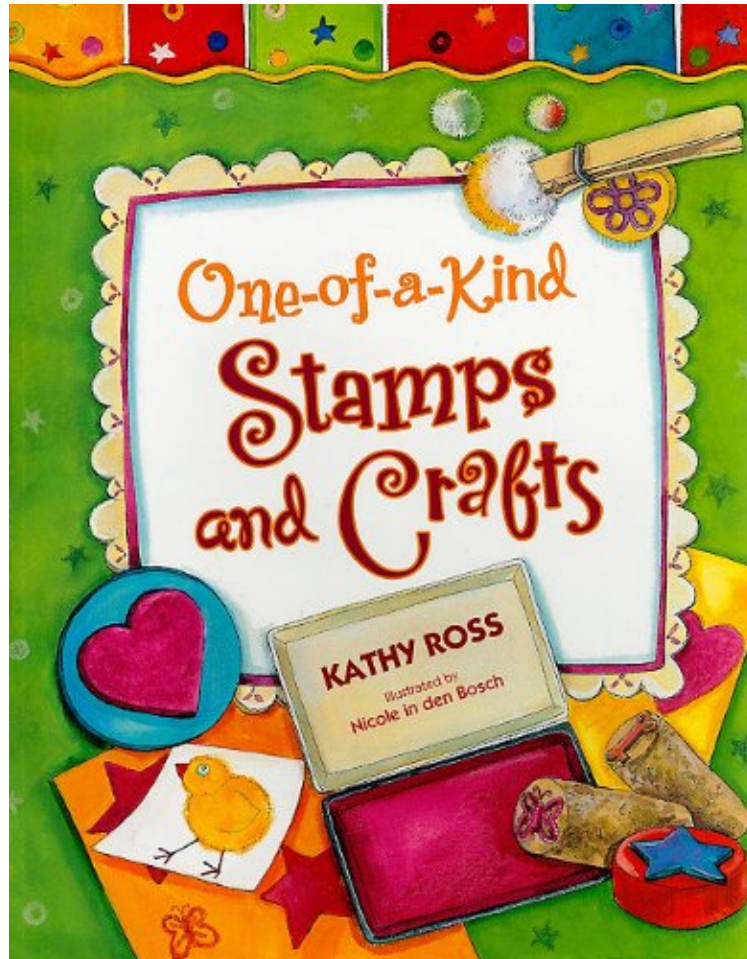

There's nothing more frustrating than wanting to have a hobby and be unable to afford it. With just a few materials, some purchased, some recycled and "green," some that you'd normally have around the house and a bit of ingenuity, you'll have just the formula for some good creative fun. For example, if you have some old puzzle pieces, an empty pill bottle container, some markers, craft glue, some ink pads, some odd assorted collage materials, and a handful of wiggle eyes you can

make some very unique stamps to use on cards. The puzzle piece chick and frog stamps in this book are simply adorable! In the introductory note the author gives a few hints to make your stamping experience a successful one. Once you get started you and your friends won't just want to spend rainy days working on your projects, you'll be nudging aside that homework to work on your new creations. There are also instructions for an "Ink Pad Storage Shelf" and a very handy "Stamp Storage Box." You might want to find a plastic box or other storage container to store those "interesting" materials that might just turn into a stamp. If you have learned to think "green" you'll soon have a box or two of ready materials for your creations.
