Low quality paper-- downgrade in quality from previous year's (2008) versionBy Deanna S.I had this calendar from 2008 and I decided I wanted another one for my desk in my classroom (I teach HS) since my students get a kick out of it. I figured it would be mostly the same, and the pictures are, but it was printed on MUCH cheaper paper with less vibrant pictures. Maybe it's just that I have the old version and I recognize the downgrade in paper and printing quality that had me disappointed, though. It looks like it was printed on newsprint and the papers have no resiliency or glossy finish. Maybe that's better if you do as intended and use the pages before as origami paper for the next date?0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. The novelty is good, but doing it one year was enough for me.By GoldenLeafI bought this last year as a gift, but ended it up using it myself. The novelty of it is good, and it can be fun. It comes with a little cheat sheet for some of the symbols and extra folding instructions. There are some that require two days to put together (the first half is done one day, second half done the next). On weekends it typically only gives tips and extra instructions, but no extra origami to fold.I've come to find that some of the patterns lack in creativity,

and sometimes the instructions are very unclear. It also requires you to sometimes use extra paper and materials (like plain computer paper), which is not an issue for me, but is not included in this calendar. Regardless, I enjoyed doing it, but I won't be buying it for myself again next year.

For paper-folding pros and newbies alike, the Origami Calendar is packed with inspiration and fun. Endorsed by Origami USA, here are hundreds of lively projects made simple with illustrated step-by-step instructions. Fold a fierce beast. Create action figurines. Repurpose a dollar bill.
