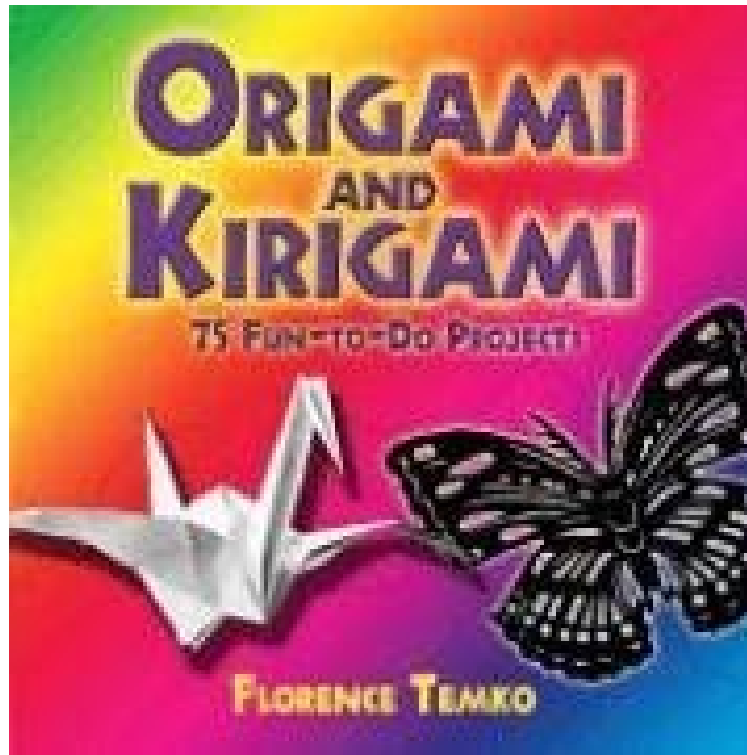

The basic ideas for folding are broken down into parts, starting with a "standard" fold that is used in various different origami designs. Most other books don't show you the directions this way. I like the kirigami part too. However, it's a little too brief for me and not as easy to follow as the origami part. I like the history section on each artform.
