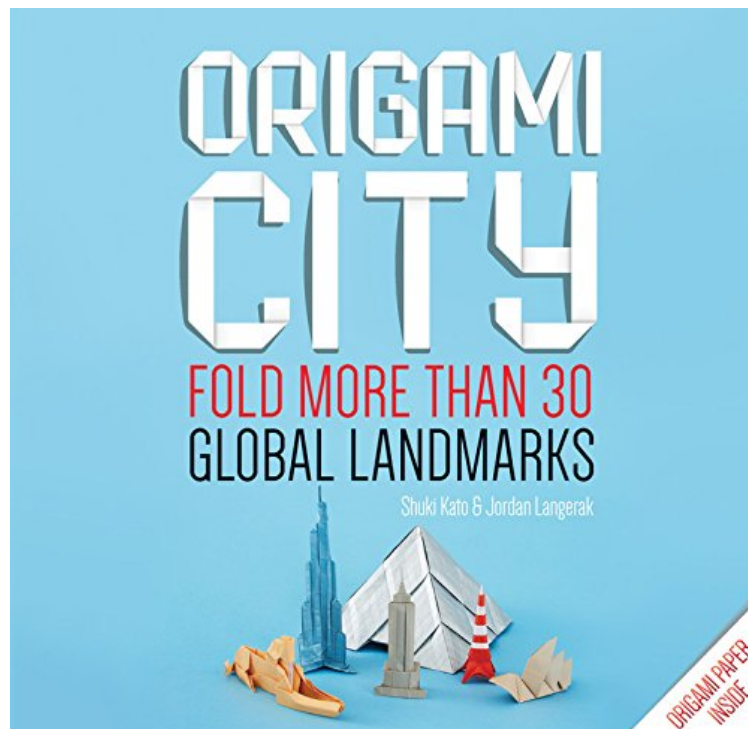

Starting in San Francisco with the Transamerica Pyramid, the book follows the international date line east through New York, London, Paris, and out to Tokyo and Sydney. Each project features clear, illustrated steps, along with color photography of the paper landmarks in their real homes. Up front the book explains origami basics for complete beginners and some of the more unusual folds used for more experienced origamists. The book comes complete with 20 sheets of colored origami paper, to get you started and ensure your first projects really look the part. Get folding!
