I was put off by the prettier ones requiring cutting and glueing. Also, most of the flower patterns just fall apart once you put them together. The way that you secure the petals to each other is not secure, so don't think that once you make the flower it will keep together for 2 seconds (unless of course you glue them). Some of the patterns don't even look like flowers, and the ones that look nice mostly require cheating - cutting with scissors or using glue. There is also a huge lack in variety of leaf and calyx patterns. Don't waste your time with these two little pamphlets.
