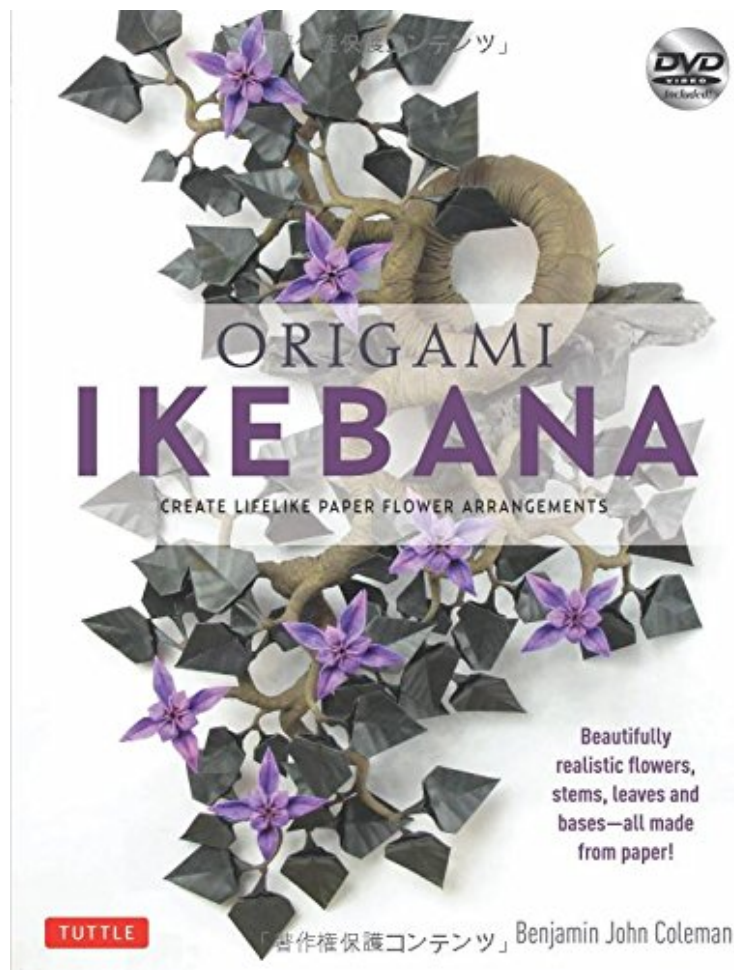

Folders who pay close attention to the process for folding this base should have no problem making the majority of the flowers featured in *Origami Ikebana*. His patented glow-fold diagrams highlight the surface of the area that will move during the fold with an orange, semitransparent glow. In the step following the fold, a narrow trace of orange glow is visible along any open edges to indicate where the glowing surface went.
