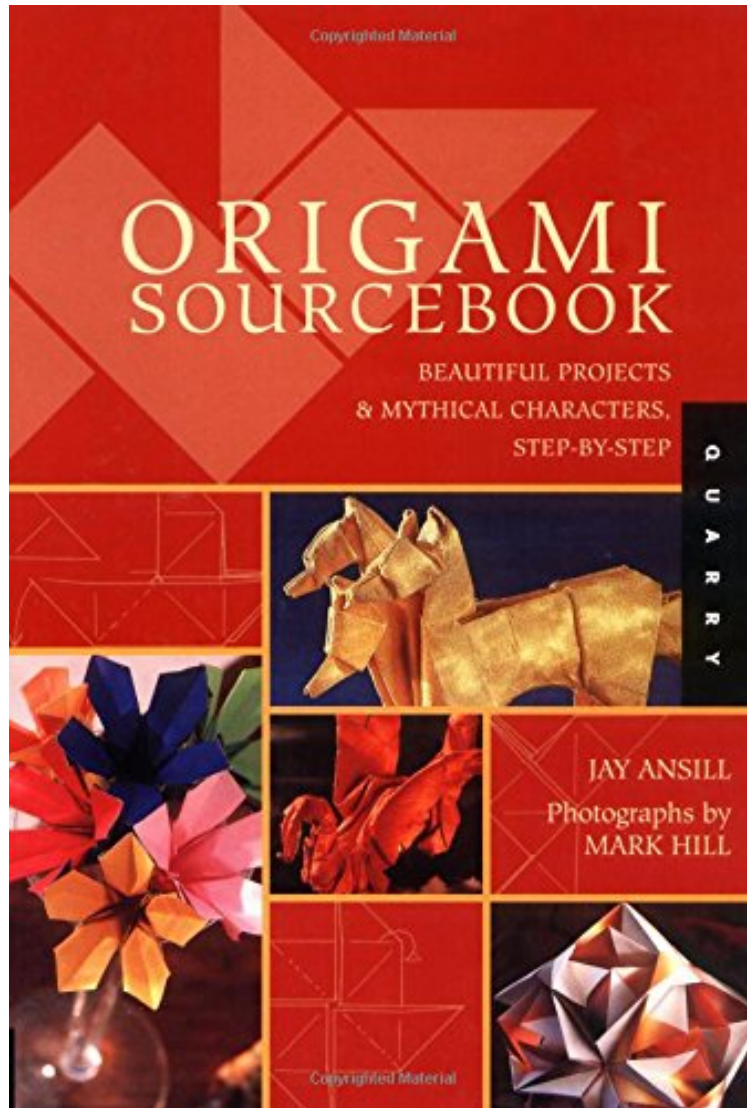

the best of my ability to tell, the "Mythical Characters" part of this book is identical to that earlier book; so I am only reviewing that part of "Origami Sourcebook". Here's what's good: these are lovely models by well-known and -respected origami artists. But that's all... the diagrams, presumably drawn by the author, are quite frankly terrible. It is possible for an experienced origamist to successfully create the models from these diagrams and instructions, but they are as much hindrance as help. I have so far finished the witch/wizard and Shiva models and am working on the long-tailed dragon and Cerberus models, but in every model I have done so far I have found multiple mistakes in the diagrams and instructions. There are a lot of models in this book that I have not found in other books. Reading other reviews, it seems that the author has other books that contain them though. However, if you are like me, and have a collection of origami books, I'd recommend adding this one to the collection as it does not contain your run of the mill "learner" models that a lot of books seem to contain. Although the diagrams are not perfect, I don't think they are as bad as some other reviewers make them out to be. I'm not convinced that absolute beginners could cope with the majority of this book, but I think it contains a lot of models to aspire to if you can't fold them first try!
