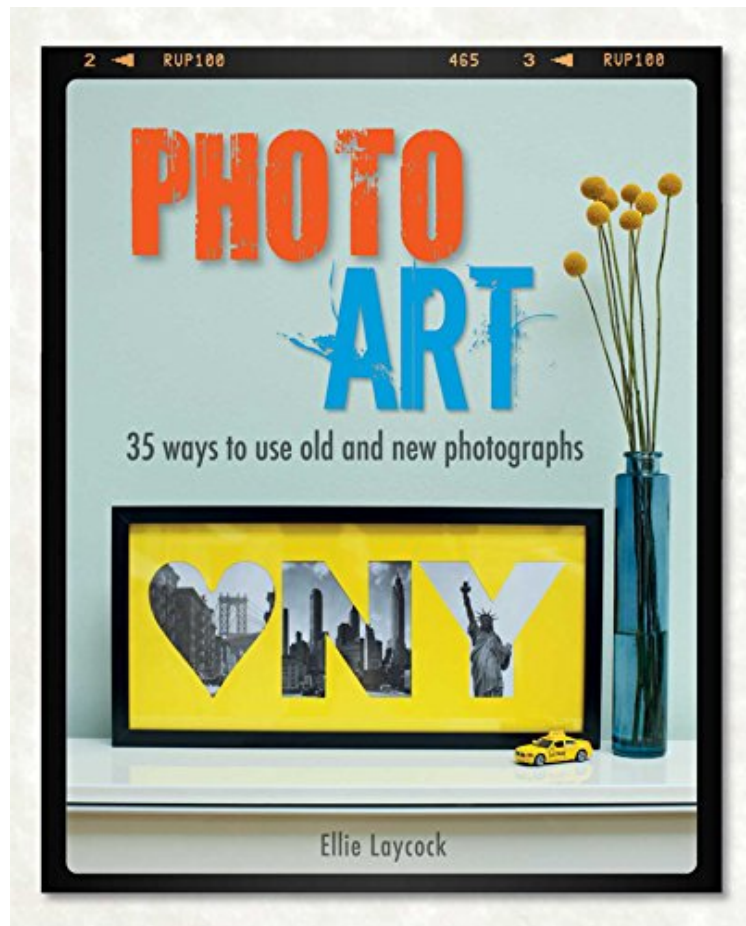

They range in scale from tiny desk top photo holders that incorporate unique recycled elements to super-sized wall art and everything in between. There are projects that you can wear and others to decorate in 3-D. One of my favorite aspects to some of the projects is the shapes the photos are cut into. They go beyond the standard rectangle and really add another fun element to the creation that will set it apart. There is also a nice section on image transfer.

All of us have photos at home that we like and want to keep, but all too often they lay hidden away in packets or on a digital hard drive where we don't get to see or enjoy them. Ellie Laycock's aim with this book is to bring those images out of the dark and teach you how to use them to create wonderful new things for the home or personalized gifts for loved ones, so that these special images get a chance to shine. Discover how to use old negatives to make a window decoration, as well as how to print onto fabric to create a unique tote or purse. Find out ways of using paper prints, from transferring images onto ceramics to decorating table tops. Unusual methods of framing photos are also included—why not try using old vintage watch housings as bracelet picture frames? Any techniques you'll need to know are clearly explained, making this an ideal source of inspiration for crafters both new and experienced.
