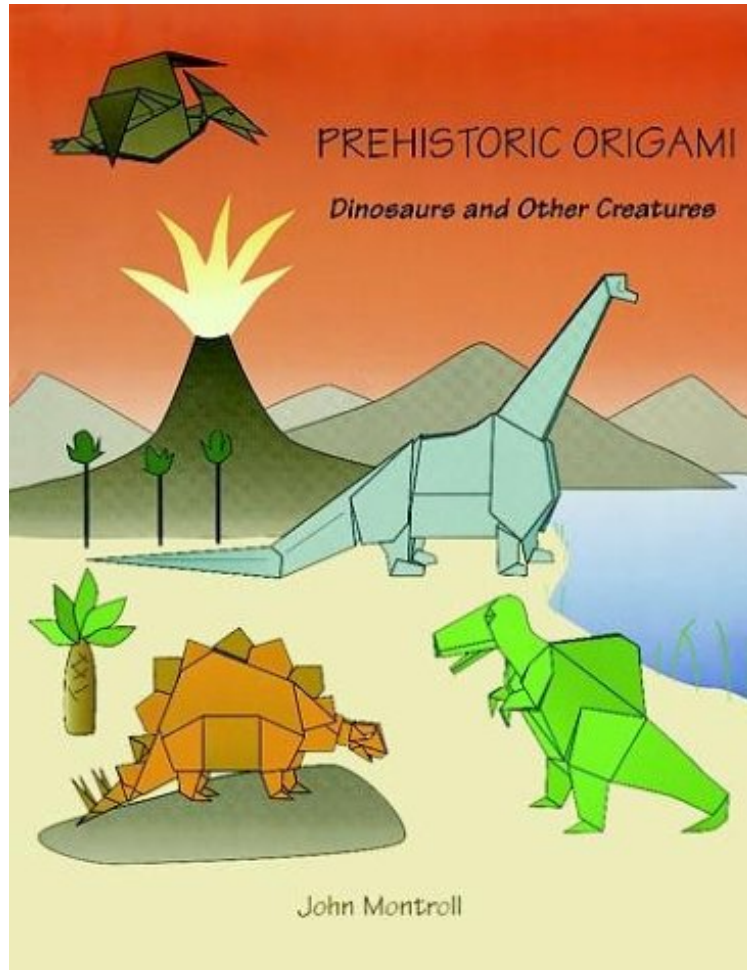

I bought this book to make an Origami Dinosaur collection and

found that the diagrams are really easy to follow and are clear, too. These designs, however, are for people who have had some experience folding origami and are comfortable with steps such as sinks, etc. Except for a few designs at the very beginning (which are plain and simple) the rest of the book details out intermediate to complex models. John has also taken the pains to categorize each of the designs / dinosaurs into the level of complexity. I heard that origami was supposed to be relaxing...not so much! If you have been doing origami for a while and know the folds, then I suppose that it would be quite enjoyable but if you are a first time 'attempter' or a beginner I would look into something else.
