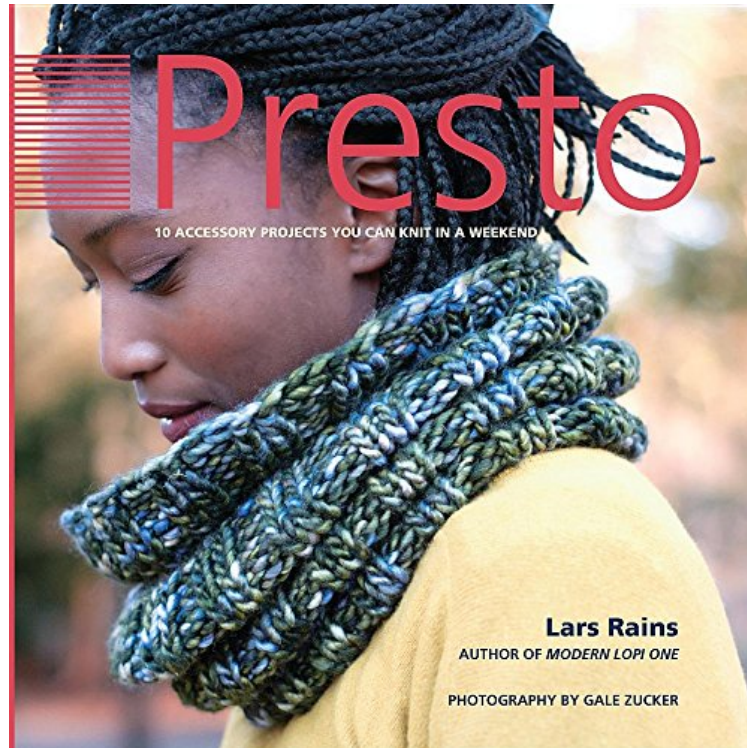

I purchased it because I wanted to make the item on the cover, and am mid-way through the process. I learned the technique needed to make the rounds on YouTube (God bless YouTube) and, instead of giving up, I frogged what was wrong and kept going. My main complaint is the cost of the book; however, it is full of color pictures on nice paper so the price per pattern evens things out a bit.

In this collection, Lars Rains takes advantage of the vibrant colors and bulky weight of Madelinetosh's A.S.A.P. yarn to create 10 striking designs that knit up quickly. These patterns explore unusual constructions and innovative techniques that are combined to produce classic accessories with a modern and minimalist twist.

About the AuthorEven though Lars Rains has been knitting for over twenty years, he still learns something new with each project he completes. He firmly believes that every knitter has the potential to become a successful designer with the proper tools and techniques. His design work has been featured in Vogue Knitting, Knit Simple, Knit Edge,

Chicago Knits, and Knitty. His patterns have also been included in collections for Malabrigo Yarns, Noro Yarns, and Cascade Yarns. Lars recently published his first book of Icelandic sweater patterns, *Modern Lopi: One*. A design from that book won the Grand Prize in the inaugural Independent Designers contest at the leading yarn industry association's fashion show.
