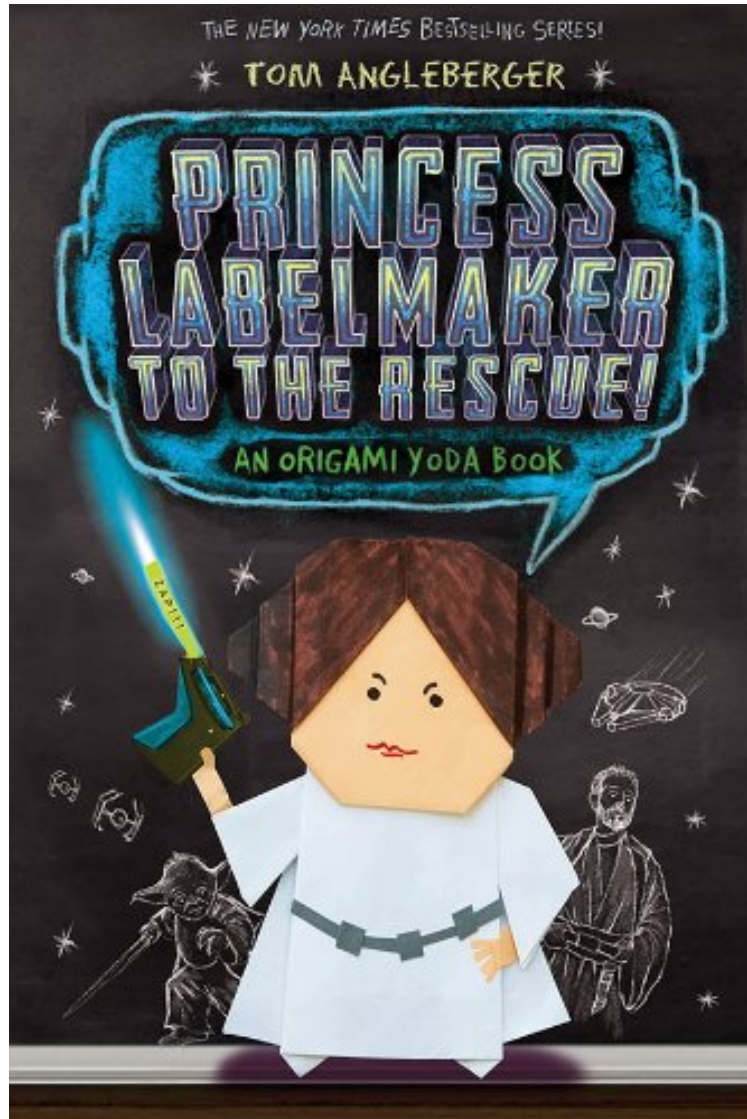

Aidan and I have really enjoyed reading this series aloud even though he is much younger (8) than the target middle school audience. Parents should be aware that early in the book there is a chapter dealing with a character's sexual orientation and the bullying that accompanies it. WARNING- please be aware when choosing this book. I am shocked! My 3rd grader has LOVED the Origami Yoda books and up until this one I have considered them to be an acceptable age appropriate choice. Early on in this book the problem brought to Origami Yoda is that some bullies "crapped all over" another student because they think he is "gay" - and even the protagonist says he wonders if this particular student is "gay". This is a very sensitive subject and should not be brought up lightly in a book that is meant to be humorous and entertaining. This topic / discussion certainly does have its place - but I did not expect it to be treated so casually in an "Origami Yoda" book.
