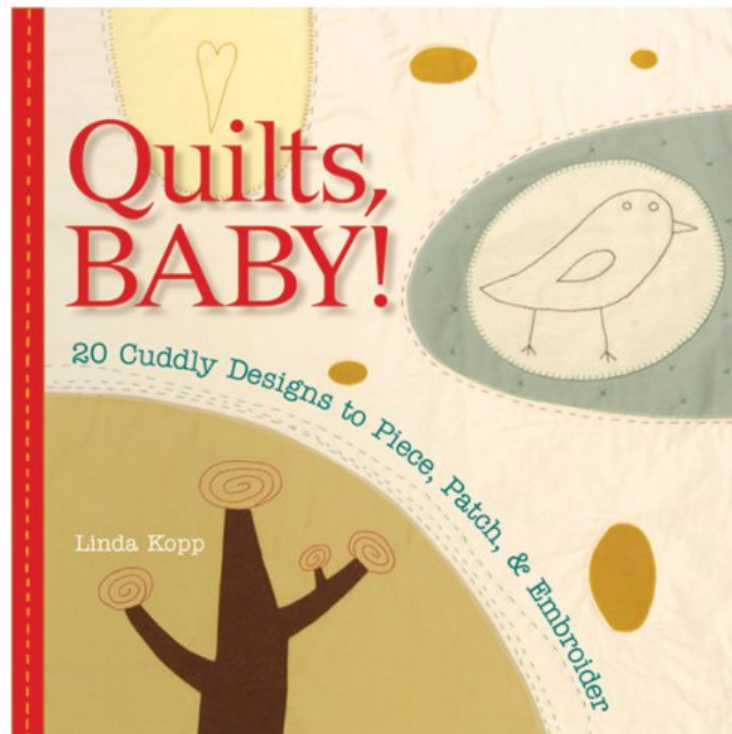

However, in using the pattern I found that the labeling on the patterns is incorrect (pieces are named incorrectly as well as directions on whether 1/4 " seam allowance has already been added or not). In addition, the directions are just okay, not very clear or detailed. The book claims that the directions are easy to follow and good for beginning quilters, which I do not believe is true. I would only recommend this book to a beginning quilter IF they had someone with experience who could help them; if not, I'd suggest taking a pass on this one.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Instructions tell you to enlarge them with a copier machine. I don't have a machine that will do that for me and it is a real inconvenience. I have lots of quilting books and that process is already done for you. You just have to trace around them in the books. However, I don't like 'traditional' quilts, like flying geese patterns but rather more contemporary looks. This book is very inspiring, offering 20 designs that you never thought you'd see on quilts, very unique and contemporary. I gave it

three stars because the instructions and diagrams are pretty basic. If you want step by step, detailed instructions on exactly what to buy and how to cut it, this isn't for you. If you're comfortable with winging it, you'll enjoy the book.
