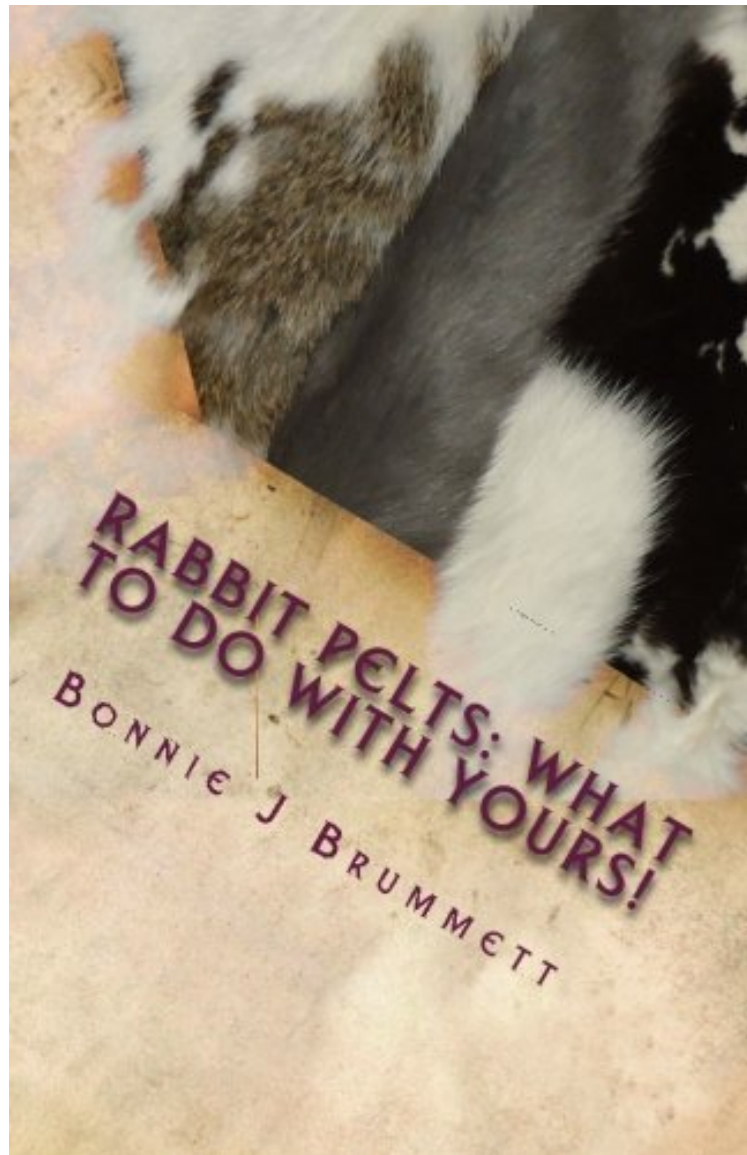

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This book provides an adequate description of how to dispatch a rabbit, primary dealing with cervical dislocation and skinning (no info about eviscerating or meat usage). She then provides a list of tanning methods, but only directions on 2 methods. The last portion is about how to prepare skins if you wish to sell them to the author. This is information you would think would be free. For the price, I was not expecting a great deal and i had read other reviews, but I will give 3 stars because I feel she could revise to include more information. That being said, I will buy the other book because I am looking for information on using the skins.
